Introduction

'Gender Responsive Resilience and Intersectionality in Policy and Practice (GRRIPP) South Asia is a four-year global collaboration and knowledge-exchange project, launched in 2020 through signing a memorandum of understanding between University of Dhaka, Bangladesh and University College London (UCL), United Kingdom implemented by the Institute of Disaster Management and Vulnerability Studies (IDMVS), University of Dhaka. GRRIPP-South Asia aims to bring together theory, policy and practice to promote a gender-responsive approach to disaster management and development. GRRIPP South Asia is awarded to IDMVS as part of activity of Gender and Disaster Network, Bangladesh Country Hub, which was launched in 2018 at IDMVS with the support of UN Women. 'Gender Responsive Resilience and Intersectionality in Policy and Practice (GRRIPP) - Networking Plus Partnering for Resilience' is funded by the Global Challenges Research Fund. Professor Dr. Mahbuba Nasreen, the winner of Mary Fran Myers Gender and Disaster Network Award, 2016 and a Visiting Professor of UCL Institute for Risk and Disaster Reduction (IRDR), is the Regional Lead of GRRIPP South Asia. GRRIPP South Asia have awarded seven (07) commissioning projects to researchers India, Nepal, Sri Lanka and Bangladesh to accomplish the goal of making the vulnerable communities resilient through intersectional need-based policies and practices.

International Webinar on Disaster Risk Reduction – Climate Change Adaptation and Intersectionality: Bangladesh and Global Perspective

An International webinar on the eve of International Day for Disaster Risk Reduction (IDDR) on 12 October 2021 was jointly organized by the Institute of Disaster Management and Vulnerability Studies (IDMVS), University of Dhaka and Gender and Disaster Network (GDN) Bangladesh country Hub on a very pertinent theme "Disaster Risk Reduction- Climate Change Adaptation and Intersectionality: Bangladesh and Global Perspective."

The event involved more than 170 participants comprising policy makers, researchers, and practitioners from home and abroad.

Dr. Md. Enamur Rahman, MP, honourable State Minister, Ministry of Disaster Management and Relief was the Chief Guest and Professor Dr. Md. Akhteruzzaman, honourable Vice-Chancellor of University of Dhaka was the chair. Professor Mahbuba Nasreen presented the thematic paper. Other speakers include Professor Dr. Khondoker Mokaddem Hossain, Md. Mohsin, Mr. Mihir

R. Bhatt, Professor Dr. Maureen Fordham, one of the

founding members of Gender and Disaster Network (GDN) and Principal Investigator GRRIPP, joined the introductory session virtually. Professor Nasreen highlighted the background of International Day for Disaster Risk Reduction, she emphasized on the importance of mainstreaming gender and intersectionality in policies and practices of disaster management. Dr. Nasreen highlighted the activities of 7 commissioned projects of the GRRIPP South Asia region - Bangladesh, Nepal, India, and Sri Lanka. For policy recommendations, she emphasized prioritizing the intersectional communities while providing social safety net support, spreading awareness on adaptive practices. Her recommendations also include conducting more gender inclusive research and development projects to mainstream the need of people who are leaving behind. Distinguished speakers appreciated GRRIPP-IDMVS initiatives for introducing intersectionality approach in DRR issues. Honourable State Minister, MODMR expressed his satisfaction and thanked the organizers for inviting him at the event. He mentioned that the new concept will support for improving the DRR policy. In his concluding remarks honourable Vice-Chancellor highly acclaimed the organizers on linking the inclusive and intersectional approach in disaster management. He has extended his gratitude and thanked the honourable State Minister for his positive notes.

Workshop on “Message Sharing on Human Rights”

One of the Bangladesh-based awardees from GRRIPP South Asian Region - “Integrated Environmental Development Society (IEDS)” - organized a workshop on “Message Sharing on Human Rights” at Durgapur Upazila of Netrakona District. IEC Material Distribution

IEC material distribution by one of the leading commissioning projects named "Towards Human Rights and its Violation Expulsion" by Integrated Environment Development Society (IEDS), Bangladesh.

To disseminate and circulate the messages on human rights, under "Towards Human Rights and its Violation Expulsion" project IEDS printed 60,000 leaflets and 2,000 posters for the mass peoples of the area. In this month of November total 15,500 leaflets and 550 posters were distributed for the project beneficiaries.

Through the colorful posters and leaflets, students, teachers, villagers, pedestrians, civil society and project beneficiaries are getting opportunity to learn how to build social resistance against sexual harassment, the equal dignity of women and men and punishment provision law and fines for early marriage from the poster hanging in different strategic locations.

Social Inclusion Consultation

JTSDS, India have been conducting national consultations to enhance gender, intersectionality, and social inclusion perspectives in Disaster Pedagogies. The first consultation took place in December 2021, which gave JTSDS feedback on their own curriculum about the integration of intersectional gender consciousness and social inclusion perspectives. Participants from almost 20 higher education institutions in the Disaster Management and Climate Change higher education sector deliberated on how to make pedagogies more socially inclusive, intersectional and gender-aware.

Then, in February 2022, JTSDS conducted a Social Inclusion Consultation. Experts spoke on Dalit feminist

standpoint epistemologies, situated knowledge, and integrating standpoint epistemologies into knowledge production in the Disaster Management discipline, as well as in Indigenous Epistemologies & Decolonial Thought.

In March 2022, JTSDS hosted a third workshop on “Infusing Gender Consciousness, Intersectionality & Social Inclusion Perspectives in Disaster Pedagogies”.

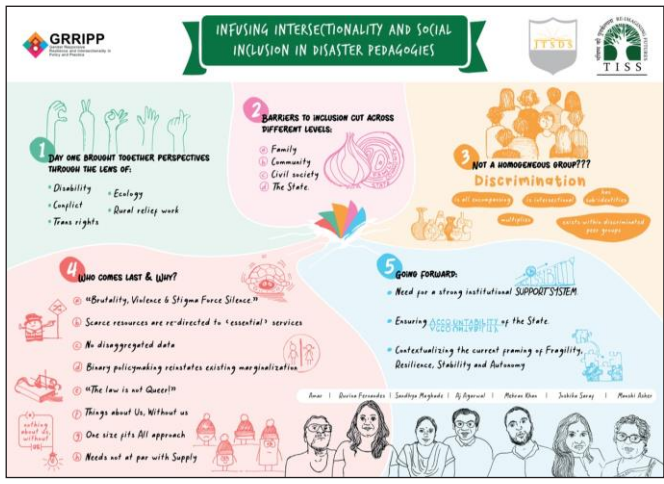

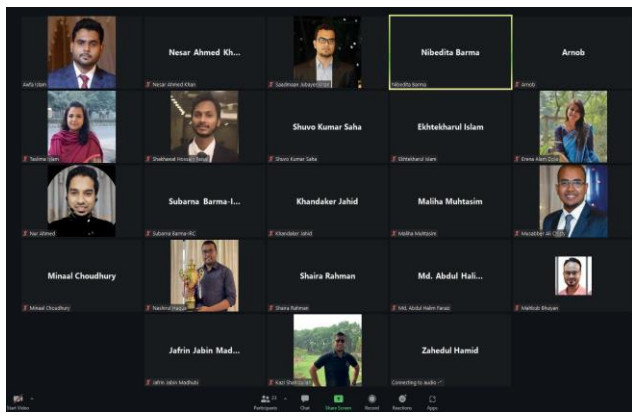

A 15-Days Certification Program on “Disaster Risk Reduction, Humanitarian Response and Intersectionality”

The Research team led by a group of reearchers of different universitis including Bangladesh University of Professionals (BUP), University of Dhaka and Bangladesh Open University launched a 15-Days Certification Programme on “Disaster Risk Reduction, Humanitarian Response and Intersectionality”.

The certification programme started in February and was inaugurated by Professor Mahbuba Nasreen, GRRIPP-South Asia in an interactive Zoom session with the participants. The 15-days certification programme has continued over February and March in a hybrid method, both online and offline, and sessions are proving to be dynamic and engaging.



Two-month training session in sewing machines for women survivors of abuse

IEDS, Netrokona, Bangladesh has hosted a two-month training session in sewing machines for women survivors of abuse. The training was inaugurated by the Upazila Social Welfare Officer, Netrakona Md. Sarwer Hossain, and presided over by Shamim Kabir, the Executive Director of IEDS. The training was facilitated by Nupur Dhar, who is a renowned trainer from Ministry of Social Welfare. IEDS has also arranged trainings and workshops for school-teachers, students and parents on human rights issues.

GRRIPP South Asia Regional Management Team visited the IEDS project area and remotely evaluated their on-ground activities and involvement with community stakeholders and also paid a visit to Deshbuddhi Disability and Autistic School.

Roundtable on 'Intersectionality in Redressing Gender & DRR: #BreakingTheBias'

A roundtable on 'Intersectionality in Redressing Gender & DRR: #BreakingTheBias' was jointly organised by Gender Responsive Resilience and Intersectionality in Policy and Practice (GRRIPP) South Asia, Gender and Disaster Network, Institute of Disaster Management and Vulnerability Studies at Dhaka University, and the Daily Star which was held on 9 March 2022 at the capital's Daily Star Centre, in observance of International Women's Day.



Professor Dr. Mahbuba Nasreen, regional lead GRRIPP South Asia, was one of the special guests in the conference and chaired a session named 'Disaster and Vulnerability.' One of the awardees of South Asia, Bangladesh University of Professionals, organised a plenary session 'Curriculum Development on Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR), Humanitarian Response and Intersectionality' to seek feedback on the draft curriculum from experts and members of diverse communities. Professor Ishrat Shamim, President, Centre for Women and Children Studies, Dr. Towhidul Islam, Dean, Begum Rokeya University, Rangpur, Dr. Dilara Zahid, Director, (Acting), IDMVS also spoke on the occasion.

Plenary session on 'Disaster and Vulnerability'

The Institute of Disaster Management and Vulnerability Studies, University of Dhaka organised a National Conference on 'Disaster, Climate and Sustainability' for National Disaster Preparedness Day, 10 March 2022.

Project data collection on maternal healthcare services

In this project, Dhaka University is examining maternal healthcare services during the COVID-19 pandemic in different disaster-prone areas of Bangladesh. The team have completed a mixed-method study in Satkhira Pouroshova, Shyamnagar, and Asashuni Upazilas of Satkhira district. Data has been collected from these key disaster-prone areas, which has helped to draw inferences about the utilization of maternal health care services among women during the COVID-19 pandemic. Further analysis and write ups to follow!



Project data collection on preventing violence against women, worker entitlements, and raising awareness of gender-based violence

SEWA Bharat, India have completed a number of activities in West Bengal, India, centred on preventing violence against women, worker entitlements, and

raising awareness of gender-based violence.

- In Nadia, a judge from the District Court lead an awareness camp on the legal rights available to women when facing gender-based violence, and their rights and entitlements under various legislations to prevent violence against women.
- In Murshidabad, an awareness camp was held on 'Provident Fund of Beedi Workers' where officers from the Provident Fund office shared important information and addressed the issues related to access and withdrawal of Provident Fund among beedi workers.
- In Raghunahganj, Nastara Nawaz, a district level police officer, facilitated an event on gender-based violence. A special emphasis was given to the rights of young women, with a goal of increasing awareness of forced marriages.
- In Lalgola, a District Court judge facilitated an awareness camp on the legal rights of women to lead a safe, dignified and violence free life.
- In Behrampore, an awareness camp was organised on 'Addressing Domestic Violence' with the domestic workers in the presence of the Protection officer.

Completion of Data Collection of the Tribhuvan University, Maharajgunj Nursing Campus, Kathmandu, Nepal

The research team of Maharajgunj Nursing Campus (Dr. Muna Sharma, Dr. Hridaya Devkota, and Prof. Chandrakala Sharma) has completed data collection through IDI, KII, and three FGDs. Two Workshops were conducted with local stakeholders including the head and the local leaders in Marshyangdi Rural Municipality and Palungtar Municipality of Nepal which were the areas hit by earthquake and flood.

She emphasised on the inclusiveness of intersect population in the policy level and shared her long experiences on water, sanitation and hygienemanagement challanges during and post disaster situation. As the theme of MH Day 2022 is 'Making Menstruation a Normal Fact of Life by 2030', she proposes some sustainable approaches to ensure availability, accessibility and affordability during Menstruation hygiene from South Asian Perspective. In this Consultation Workshop, MHM App named 'Ononna' was launched which is developed as a "Knowledge Hub" for women and girls and can be used across the globe.
